We are the **Arts Council of Wales**. We have a **fund** called **Go and See**.



A **fund** is money that people or organisations can get to help them do their work.



This **fund** is part of the **Creative Learning through the Arts** programme.



This **fund** is for children and young people aged up to 16.



This document will tell you all about the **Go and See fund**. And if it is right for your school. This document will tell you how to apply for this **fund**.



About this fund

We think the arts are fun and exciting for children and young people. And helps them to learn.



This **fund** will help schools pay for visits to arts and cultural events.



Schools can apply for up to £1000 to pay for these visits.



This **fund** is for any local authority school in Wales.



Lots of schools are already enjoying visits using this **fund**.

What we will pay for



We especially want to help schools who have not had **creative learning funds** before.



You need to tell us how your visit will help children and young people.



Some things we might pay for are:

- Transport costs
- Ticket costs
- Workshop costs



Try to get good deals on whatever you buy.

We can give you most of the money for your visit. But you'll need to get a bit from other places as well.

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What we won't pay for

We won't pay for:

- Buying equipment.
- Visits that are already booked.
- Visits that are already paid for.
- Events outside Wales.
- Food and drink.
- Events at the school.
- Things you could do without the **fund**.



We know that some schools are worse off than others. For example, some schools are in areas that are very poor.



If you think we should pay for something we said we won't, tell us why.

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How to apply

Only schools can apply for this **fund**. You will need to fill in an application form on our website.

You will need to tell us:

- About your planned visit. Including the date. •
- The cost of the visit and how much money you want from us.
- Where you will get the rest of the money you need from.
- About the children and young people who will be going on the visit. Including their ages.
 - How the visit will help learning.
 - About your school.

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When to apply



You can apply for this **fund** anytime.

We will give you a form to help you write this report.



We won't give you more money in the future if you don't write a report.
