Creative Learning Training Facilitators application guidance

What is Explore?

Creative Learning Cymru are proud to unveil an exciting new chapter in our mission to place creativity at the heart of education, following Arts Council of Wales's recent successful application to the Curriculum for Wales grant support programme. Funded through a £3m investment by Welsh Government, match-funded by National Lottery funding distributed by the Arts Council of Wales, the £6m three-year programme will run until March 2028.

The new programme will support schools across Wales to reimagine curriculum design and teaching and learning experiences, deepen engagement, and unlock learner potential through bold, creative approaches. This comes at a pivotal moment in Welsh education, aligning closely with the ambitions of the Curriculum for Wales. There will be a clear focus on literacy, wellbeing, and creativity.

Explore

Explore is a dynamic, creative, nationwide programme of free in-person professional learning opportunities for teachers, senior support staff and leaders. The opportunities are designed to work as both introductory and refresher training and will offer a mixture of self-reflection activities, advice on planning for creativity and practical tips on integrating creative learning into practice.

Attendees can expect to explore techniques and approaches to help them begin, or further develop their practice in:

- Embedding the Four Purposes of the Curriculum for Wales, with a focus on developing enterprising and creative contributors.
- Aligning to the integral skills by developing creative and critical thinking skills, helping learners to thrive in an ever-evolving world.
- Improving literacy and oracy, especially for our most disadvantaged learners.
- Improving learner wellbeing and engagement by making learning more meaningful and inclusive.

- Placing the learner voice at the centre of curriculum design and school development planning.

FAQs – Frequently Asked Questions

Who is Explore for?

Teachers, Senior Teaching Assistants, Curriculum leads, Leadership team members.

How many Explore sessions will there be, and where?

They will be in-person sessions at six locations spread across Wales. 2 sessions per term in each location (12 sessions per term)

How long are the sessions?

Each session will run from 9:30 – 14:30 and lunch will be provided.

What Days are the Explore session on?

All **Explore** sessions will take place on a Tuesday or a Thursday.

How much will I be paid, and how many sessions will I be offered?

Creative Learning Training Facilitators will be paid £300 per day, plus travel expenses. We anticipate offering the Facilitators between 5- and 8-days work per academic year.

What does the content and shape of the day look like?

A bilingual mix of fun, playful, self-reflective and purposeful activities and dialogical exercises with a clear and practical focus, which explore and introduce participants to different applications of Creative Learning in the classroom. There will be three distinct **Explore** themes: Creative Learning across the Curriculum, Wellbeing and Literacy – all of which will be useful to help teachers with curriculum design.

What will be the make-up of the training delivery teams?

Each **Explore** session will be delivered bilingually by a team of two Project Leads from the Creative Learning team and one Creative Learning Training Facilitator.

How will schools apply, and is there a cost for teachers to attend?

Teachers will just sign up via an online registration process. The sessions are free.

Will I be trained?

Yes, you will have to attend a paid train-the-trainer session. Instructions and guidance on delivery style, content and materials will be supplied in this session.

What are the key dates I need to be available for?
